





### Most Worshipful The Grand Master

Excerpts from the address delivered by M.W.Bro. Gutha Krishnan Selvarajan, Most Worshipful The Grand Master when he was the Regional Grand Mark Master of Southern India.

M W the Grand Master, M W Bro. Arun Chintopanth, Past Grand Master, M W Bro. H P Mathur, R W the Regional Grand Mark Master of Western India, R W Bro. Govind Lal Shahu, R W the District Grand Mark Master of Madras, R W Bro. Balaji Singh, Past Regional Grand Mark Masters,

and Brethren in all.

It gives me great pleasure to once again welcome you for the second time this Morning. Brethren, this Degree of Mark Masonry is generally called Practical Degree. There is a School of Thought that this Degree is so self-sufficient, in form, content and teachings that it would remain so, even if the Craft, Royal Arch or other Masonic Degrees did not exist.

The Ceremony of
Advancement comprises of
the story of how a sorrowful
Fellow craft ultimately was
hailed as a Mark Master. It
has the highs and lows of a
Meto drama, song and a
fitting climax. But, to a curious
Mason, this Beautiful Degree of
Advancement broadly teaches
Three Lessons.

The First one the obvious message. It tells us that to be successful in life, one needs the initiative, perseverance and hard work, that, it is always too soon to quit and never, never, never to give up, that, there can be no success without failures.

Thomas Alva Edison was in search of a Home and ultimately, he found one for rent. After taking Edison through the Home, the proud Owner asked him, "Sir, are you now happy with the Home?" Edison, after a pause said, "It is generally good, but there is one more requirement for me. The waste paper basket found in the corner is too small for my researches, I would like to have a bigger basket, because I shall be failing and wasting lot of stationery on my researches". Brethren, history tells us that Edison failed 11,000 times, but made 1000 inventions and he is hailed as one of the Greatest Scientists ever lived.

To my mind, this Ceremony of Advancement conveys to us Two other deeper Lessons. The First one is that while we discharge the duties of our station, we

should continue to act in conformity to the sublime precepts of the order that

we learn in the Craft Rituals, namely, to do justice, love mercy, practice charity, maintain harmony and endeavour to live in unity and brotherly love. In other words, though the Goal of attaining

success is important, the manner. the method and the mode of pursuing and achieving the goal of success is equally or perhaps more important. The means should justify the end. The course we pursue to achieve the objective should be honourable and in consonance with the lessons we learn in the Craft Ritual.

The 2nd significance is that many times, one is overcome with pride by his own success. He tends to think that because of his own efforts, he is able to achieve his goal. But the Mark Degree teaches us that nothing is achieved or

achievable without the grace, guidance and blessings of the Great Overseer of the Universe. Though the skilful fellow craft by his ingenuity, made a stone for the Building, the same was rejected, thrown away and lost.

But ultimately by the grace of God, the very stone was found and was decorated as the Headstone of the Building while the Fellow craft was promoted to the

Honourable Degree of Mark Master. Realising that he owes his success and recognition to the Almighty God, the Craftsmen exclaimed "Thanks be to God, I have marked well". Therefore, this Degree

teaches us that when one marks well in his endeavours and succeeds, his thanks shall be only to God. We should accept success with humility since it comes only through the blessings and divine grace of the Great Overseer of the Universe. This to my mind, is the other significance of this beautiful

Degree.

Brethren, the Statistics show that only about a 25% of the Master Masons are made as Mark Master Masons. It should be therefore our endeavour to see that more Master Masons ate advanced to this beautiful Degree, so that the sublime precepts of the order are applied and understood in their day-today lives.

#### ARE WE TRUE MASONS?

A short paper presented by V W Bro. G K SeIvarajan, W. The Dy. RGM of Southern India at the Installation Meeting of Lodge Om Vigneswara No.218. Chennai on 23.3.2001

Brethren, this evening I would like to place before you a question for your kind consideration to


> ponder over and find an answer, though not today, at least in the future.

The question that I place before you, me and every one of us here is "Are we true Masons" or "Are we Masons in the true sense of the term?"


Brethren when we were initiated into masonry, or when we were shown the light of freemasonry we are first enamoured of the citriual pleasure or citriual phase or citriual side of Freemasonry. During the fellowship, we are impressed by the fun, frolic,

food and fellowship, we meet and greet brethren sometimes for the first time, we drink a toast to the health of masonic dignitaries, we break bread with brethren, drink to the health of poor and distressed masons, wishing them a speedy recovery and so on and so forth. After a particular stage, we find that this citriual phase of the fellowship is not a Be all and end

all of masonry and that the fellowship

periphery. Sooner we realise that these pleasures have a limitation in terms of age, health etc.,

Then brethren, we move on to the ritual phase or ritual side of masonry. We have been allotted portions of the rituals, we memorize them we deliver

them with gestures, articulations and emphasis, we try to create impressions not only in the minds of the candidates but also in the minds of the brethren assembled. Soon we find that there is a limitation to this also. By absence of memory, age etc., and other causes, we also find that there are other masons who are equally, if not more competent to do rituals a better manner. We realise that the ritual phase is also transient and is a passing phase.

Then we move on from the citriual phase and ritual phase to the spiritual phase of masonry. We try to understand and assimilate the meaning and significance of the rituals and we find that it is more meaningful at the spiritual phase of masonry. From the preaching of ritual, we come to the practice of ritual in our day to day life, we practice masonry by way of charity, by instilling hope and faith in the minds of the sick and aged, we lend a helping hand to the distressed masons and others. We try to convert our impure thoughts, words and actions into one of the purit and positive approach. We realise that masonry ultimately is a way of life to be practiced today, everyday and, day by day. We realise that whereas the citriual phase and ritual phase means,

of masonic objectives.

When we attain that level of spiritual phase, we realise that only when we attain spiritual phase of masonry, we can truly call ourselves Masons.

Brethren, it is for each one of us to have an inner introspection on these aspects. Will we be able to answer the question every day, when we get up the in the morning "will I be a true Mason today?" and when we go to bed night "was I a true Mason today" and will we be a position to answer the question true to ourselves satisfying our inner conscience.?

Brethren now I come back to the original question "Are we true Masons". This question could not be answered by one brother to another brother or on behalf of somebody else. This question could be answered only by us belong serious and committed masons satisfying our inner conscience. I leave the question open to you, to me and everyone of us.

Let us ponder over it. "Are We True Mason?"

GMM at the consecration of Mark Lodge Vasudev No. 186 GMLI at Mumbai on 11th August 2025 Brethren, at the outset, I would first like to express my gratitude to MW The Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of India, M W Bro. Gutha Krishnan Selvarajan for giving me this opportunity to officiate as the Grand Chaplain this afternoon and also present the customary oration on the occasion of the consecration of this the Mark Lodge Vasudev No. 186 Brethren, what is consecration? According to Sadguru Jaggi Vasudev, Consecration is a live process, if you transform mud into food, we call this agriculture. If you make food into flesh and bone, we call this digestion, If you make flesh into mud, we call this cremation.

If you can make this flesh or a stone or even an empty space into a Divine possibility, that is called consecration. It is the action of making or declaring something or person(s) or building sacred. According to Wikipedia, Consecration is the solemn dedication to a special purpose or service, usually religious. The word consecration literally means "association with the sacred". It means to make sacred, to sanctify or to make pure - to make it fit for the Almighty, It is the separation of oneself from things that are unclean, especially anything that would contaminate one's relationship with God." Where is the need for consecration of a new Lodge? - simply put, it is to make this Lodge fit for the Almighty, fit to receive his blessings; so that it may flourish, prosper and bloom into a great and successful Lodge.

The next question, where is the need for an oration at the Consecration of a new Lodge. The purpose of an oration on the occasion of the consecration of a new Lodge has a high and noble aim; it is intended to carry one's mind back to the original principles of the Order, to trace the stream of Freemasonry through the quicksand which besets its course, to clear away the rocks and shoals which Time has accumulated, until we reach the clear pellucid fountain from which flow the pure and crystal waters of charity, morality, and justice. It is intended to enforce on the minds of brethren of every new lodge that they are to labour with themselves to keep the broad channel clear from all impediments or pollution; that they are to guard its landmarks and are to extend its principles with unflagging, self-denying

The Mark degree, like all other degrees, is also built around that great obsession of all Freemasons with the activity of construction,

zeal.

the only difference being that the Mark degree concentrates more on the operative side and deals with the detailed circumstances surrounding the construction of the building and the many moral lessons which are implied therein

The Mark ritual portrays a strong link between "operative" and "symbolic" masonry and takes its name from the medieval mason's "mark" which was carved into every stone that he worked upon, in order that his work could be identified, recognized as perfect, its proper place in the structure indicated and to secure payment for the work done. Many distinctive marks can be found even today in the fabric of cathedrals and castles throughout the medieval western world. According to a report in the Hindu some time ago, even the stones comprising the Taj Mahal have similar marks.

The activity of construction of a building involves the use of several different stones – some square, some oblong and as we learn in this degree, some which are neither square nor oblong all of which play an important role in the construction of the building. In like manner, the GOOTU has created many different types of men – some tall, others short; some fair, others dark; and so on - to Him, all these men are equal; however each one of them has a distinct and different role to play in the story of life, a role equally important as any other. Work and action are as much a means of cooperation and interaction with the Divine Builder as a means of self realization. While different types of stones are put to different uses, the objective is one and the same ie to construct a magnificent edifice which will stand the test of time; similarly all men are similar to these stones; "living stones" which are being built up into a spiritual temple of perfection, one that is created virtually in one's own mind. This is the underlying central philosophy of the Mark degree - the building of all masons themselves into that

The purpose of an oration on the occasion of the consecration of a new Lodge has a high and noble aim; to impress upon the minds of brethren of every new lodge that they are to work hard to make progress in the establishment of the Lodge and avoid all impediments and hurdles which may come in their way so that they may be enabled to protect its landmarks and traditions.

As we celebrate the constitution, consecration and dedication of this the one hundred and eighty sixth Royal Ark Mariners Lodge

in the country, let us take time to reflect on the antiquity of the degree, and ensure that within the walls of this Lodge we shall always practice and encompass Brotherly Love, Justice and Truth. Let us also focus on the unique degree's symbolism and history, emphasizing its connection to the biblical story of Noah's Ark and the Great Flood. The degree draws parallels between the dangers of the flood and the challenges of life. It also underscores the importance of family and community, encouraging members to support one another and those less fortunate. The Royal Ark Mariner degree in Freemasonry utilizes the story of Noah and the Great Flood to symbolize salvation, perseverance, and faith. It emphasizes the themes of water, the Ark as a vessel of safety, and the rainbow as a divine promise. The degree's symbolism explores moral lessons about surviving trials, trusting in divine

explores moral lessons about surviving trials, trusting in divine providence, and the importance of virtues like patience and hope The RAM degree, like all other degrees, is also built around that

great obsession of all Freemasons with the activity of construction, the only difference being that the RAM degree revolves around the building of a massive boat, a great Ark; the saviour of all mankind from the devastating flood which engulfed the earth for a period of forty days and deals with the detailed circumstances surrounding the construction and the many moral lessons which are implied therein The degree symbolizes God's covenant with all those who truly call upon Him, that the waters of Noah should no more go over the earth and that He would not be

wroth with them, nor rebuke them. To quote from the ritual, "For the mountains shall depart, and the hills be removed; but my kindness shall not depart from thee, neither shall the covenant of my peace be removed, saith the Lord that hath mercy on thee." The background of this degree however, is different and more interesting than any other in Freemasonry considering that it is based on a historical occurrence which happened some 6000 years ago and is well described in the book of Genesis and referred to as the flood. It has often been referred to as "a quaint little degree with rainbow aprons". It is the dramatic narration of the construction of the great Ark and its voyage through the 40 days of the devastating flood along with a pair of every living thing on earth as well as the strong moral lessons implied therein.

From a historical perspective, the precise origins of the RAM degree are unknown but we deduce from various pieces of literature, that the RAM degree was started in the year 1772 though it is only in 1790 that there appears to be the first authentic record of the degree being worked, and subsequently, there are numerous records of elevations taking place all over the United Kingdom. In 1816 a Brother John F. Dorrington caused a renewed interest in the degree and was named Grand Commander. It was this revival that stimulated the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons to place the degree under its protection. A Grand Master's Royal Ark council was eventually formed to oversee and regulate the degree, and it is recorded that the first working under the new

constitution was in Mother Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners no. 1 in 1872.

Since then the Fraternity has grown and lodges of this degree have been practised throughout the world with over 1000 lodges working under the English Constitution. The degree is practised in other constitutions, albeit not in a separate Grand Lodge, in the Scottish Constitution under the Supreme Grand Chapter, as part of the cryptic degree, every Ark Mariners Lodge must be attached (moored) to a Mark Lodge and assumes the number of that Mark Lodge.

The qualification for membership, elevation, is that of being a Mark Master Mason, and a dispensation is mandatory for a candidate for the chair of Worshipful Commander if he has not held the office of Worshipful Master of a Lodge of Mark Master Masons. There is no Regional Grand Lodge for Ark Mariners but it is governed by the Regional Grand Mark Lodge, thereby under the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of India.

Elevation into this degree commemorates the timely care and mercy of God. The lodge is formed in the shape of a triangle which can be referenced

to the Triune Deity, a symbol known to all masons; interestingly both wardens are seated in the West. The symbol of this degree as in many others, is the Equilateral Triangle which has ever been considered the emblem of the Deity or some Divine Attribute.

The Working Tools of the degree – the axe, saw, and auger are not literal tools used in a physical

sense within the degree's ritual. Instead, they represent moral lessons and virtues, mirroring the tools Noah would have used to build the ark; these are an Axe, with which he cut down trees and squared them; a Saw, with which he sawed those trees into planks: and a Auger, with which he made holes in the planks. By the use of these tools, the Ark was formed, but these tools have other meanings, the axe felling the trees are emblematic of the fall of the old world. The Saw, dividing the timber into planks, is emblematic of the separation of Noah and his family from the rest of mankind by the Lord. The Auger, making holes in the planks, teaches us the use of affliction in producing selfabasement and searchings of the heart. As the Ark was built by these tools. So we are shown that by perseverance in faith, hope and love, we may be shut into an Ark of safety, when the elements shall melt with fervent heat, and the whole earth shall be dissolved. The rainbow is a prominent symbol in the Royal Ark Mariner degree, representing God's covenant and the promise of salvation. The symbolism of water and the Ark as a safe haven from the flood conveys themes of protection, survival, and finding refuge in times of adversity. The triangular perambulation after the entrance of the candidate was to fix in his mind the form of the Lodge. The reason he was stopped at the three points was to remind you that Wisdom, Strength and Beauty were displayed in the construction of the Ark, having also the moral signification then explained. The principal officers of the

The principal officers of the Lodge represent Noah and his two sons, Japheth and Shem. The



Triangle is also emblematic of the Sun, Moon and Stars, in this sense: those in the highest sphere of life have the largest province wherein to do good, but those of an inferior degree will be as eminently distinguished if they move regularly and prove useful members of society. The highest is he who performs his part best, not he who fills the most exalted position: for the Moon, although borrowing her light from the Sun, evidently sets forth the glory of God; and the flowers of the field declare His power equally with the stars of the firmament. No oration can be complete

without a mention of the name of the Lodge. The name "Vasudev" in general parlance refers to Lord Krishna and by using His name as part of the name of this Lodge, one is paying tribute to Him. It also has reference to an earthly Vasudev; our illustrious and eminent Past Grand Master, MW Bro. Vasudev Jamnabihar Masurekar, who after consecrating so many Lodges during his time, finally has a Lodge where he himself is the founder Worshipful Master. Brother Petitioners, while congratulating you on having acquired for yourselves a new

RAM Lodge, it is my fervent hope that the ideals and designs taught through the RAM Degree may be firmly implanted in your heart and mind. May each one of you be inspired by the story of the safe deliverance of Noah and all of the creatures on earth from the deluge and so conduct vourself in this earthly abode that you may ascend to those immortal mansions above where the rainbow ever circles the throne. Thank you, MW The Grand Master for having given me this opportunity and to all the other brethren present here for giving me a patient hearing.

### **Recorded Speeches at Mark** and RAM Lodges

#### i. Discipline and Education

In the Mark degree in addition to the explanation given to the candidate at the time of his advancement, an installed Master is also again reminded about the working tools of the Mark Degree.

This is so because in the canvas of the Craft, the Working Tools forms a small part. An incidental part. Whereas here in the Mark, the Working Tools cover a large portion of the canvas in fact almost the entire canvas because the Working Tools represent the very quintessence of Mark Masonry. The very soul of Mark Masonry.

As you are aware the Working Tools of this degree are the mallet and the chisel meant to remind us of the moral advantages of Discipline and Education.

Now what do the terms Discipline and Education mean? What do these terms, these words convey?

The Oxford dictionary defines "Discipline" as "training or way of life aimed at self control and conformity."

Brethren, this appears to be an apt definition for us in the Mark Degree. This concept is very clearly brought out in our ceremony of advancement. When the stone is rejected by the overseers and heaved over into the rubbish, the Craftsmen do not create a scene nor do they protest. They accept the verdict though they are disappointed and quite naturally too. Instead of receiving honours and recognition for their work, the craftsmen receive only reproaches for idling away time. They keep silent not because they were

incapable of protesting; it is because of the discipline, the self control that they had imbibed.

Discipline teaches us that it is our duty to repay with patience and humility involuntary and unintentional wrongs and errors. This discipline teaches one to accept the fallibility of human judgement.

At the same time it reassures us that our work will ultimately be rewarded by the greatest judge, the GOOTU.

This happens in our day to day life also. We get bugged when the response to our work is different from what we expect and then we react in a totally wrong manner and make matters worse for ourselves and others.

On the other hand, if like these overseers, we wait with patience and humility then the appropriate result, the gain will fall upon us. This is one of the important messages of Mark Masonry to all of us

The Earth itself is a great example of discipline; of forbearance and forgiveness It is disciplined to bear all adverse circumstances, all insults, or hurt inflicted upon it by its dwellers.

One may plough the land, or light a fire on it, or throw dirt, garbage or rubbish on it, yet it still gives all its resources abundantly.

Thus, we have to be disciplined to bear whatever that comes our way. We have to accept honour and dishonour, joy and sorrow with a calm and balanced mind. This is what mark masonry means by Discipline.

Coming to the second aspect Education. It is said that there are two educations - the one that teaches us how to make a living

and the other that teaches us how to live. While our academic and professional courses teach us and train us in the former kind, it is an Institution like ours - a fraternity as versatile as ours that teaches us how to live. "What sculpture is to a block of marble, education is to the soul" says Addison. "Education is not filling of a pail but lighting of a fire" says Yeats.

Education does not mean going to educational Institutions and coming out arming oneself with degrees.

Mark Twain says: "Of course I went to school. But thank God it did not interfere with my education."

Education to us Mark Masons does not mean University degrees for employment or vocation but a means of annihilation of the ego. This is again demonstrated in the incident of the Craftsman in this degree.

What does education do? It trains us at becoming proficient. But all proficient people are not successful.

My Guru would say that success is not given to all proficient people. It is not enough only to be proficient - that is not sufficient. One needs to be God bent and God ward and God dedicated only then Education will lead to proficiency which in turn will become rewarding. In the Swayamwara of Draupadi there were several proficient soldiers: Warriors of the highest order fascinated by this beautiful princes eager to win her hands. They were however not successful

It was only Arjuna who was successful. Why so?

This is because he combined his proficiency with his dedication, devotion and dependence on Krishna.

This is the subtle point made in the explanation of the working tools that discipline and education merely is not enough. They must also have the approving mark of the GOOTU.

This is what the Working Tools of this degree of Freemasonry teaches us. It tells is to combine discipline with Education and coat it with dedication, devotion and dependance on the GOOTU that we may be fitted to be part of that house not made with hands eternal in the Heavens.

My brethren this degree in Freemasonry has great lessons for us. But are we aware of all this? Should we not be aware of these lessons?

One night a burglar entered Mulla Nasaruddin's house. Mulla woke up with a start and found this burglar with a torch combing his house.

Mulla got up and quietly followed the thief. Suddenly the thief realized that Mulla was aware of his presence and tried to escape. But Mulla stood at the door and said "Don't escape I have come to help you." The thief was further shocked. "What help" he asked. "I am a thief". Said Mulla. "I am happy that you have come to burgle my house. I have been staying here for thirty years and have not found anything useful or precious. But you are an expert. I am sure you will locate something. I have therefore been following you so that we could share the booty 50:50".

Many of our Mark Lodges are like this without finding anything useful or precious. How unfortunate. We have such great treasures in this degree. It is in fact a manual for day to day living and I exhort you my brethren not only to realise and be aware of this yourselves but also bring in more members into this fold that they too may benefit.
